

INFINITY CHARTER SCHOOL'S MISSION IS TO INSPIRE, CHALLENGE, AND ENGAGE THE HEARTS, MINDS, AND SPIRITS OF GIFTED AND TALENTED CHILDREN IN CENTRAL PENNSYLVANIA.

WELCOME TO INFINITY CHARTER SCHOOL

Here is what you need to know about us:

- We are an independent K-8 school, part of the public school system.
- Our curriculum has been specifically designed to meet the needs of an otherwise under-served student population: academically and/or intellectually gifted children.
- These students account for 6-10% of the population and differ from typical students in terms of learning style, depth and complexity of understanding, and potential.
- This difference from the norm for their age group means that the education program for gifted students should be modified to meet their needs.
- We meet these needs by educating at the pace of each individual student and train our teachers to work with high-ability students.
- As part of the public school system, there is no cost to attend.
- ICS is inclusive to gifted students from all races, religions, and backgrounds.

Why what we do is so important:

The public school system is equipped to provide only part-time gifted education, but these students are gifted all the time and require individualized learning. Without a specialized program, gifted children are not challenged, become bored or, worse, may be misdiagnosed with ADHD or as hyperactive. These exceptional kids have different thinking patterns, can be hypersensitive and socially awkward, and can easily become lost in a public school system that cannot provide the support needed for them to grow.

There are currently 120 students on the ICS waiting list because our existing building is at capacity, but we have a plan to build a facility that will not only accommodate these waiting children, but also vastly improve our learning environment and expand our ability to serve gifted students with physical handicaps.

OUR FOCUS ON GIFTED AND TALENTED STUDENTS

The Pennsylvania Department of Education says a student who meets the definition of mentally gifted “needs specially designed instruction relating to academic standards and assessment. ‘Mentally gifted’: Outstanding intellectual and creative ability, the development of which requires specially designed programs or support services, or both, not ordinarily provided in the regular education program.” Gifted students are children with unique educational needs, and an individualized learning structure is imperative to their educational experience.

Infinity Charter School has a program based on authentic and individualized instruction created specifically for the gifted learner. ICS creates self-motivated, empowered students who are able to advance at their own pace in an inclusive environment that allows these amazing children to be themselves and feel they belong. The unique program provided by ICS allows students’ talents to be fostered; they are challenged, and they are given the support needed to reach their full potentials.


OUR HISTORY AND AWARDS

Infinity was conceived by Nancy Hall and Doug Morrow. In the fall of 2000, Ms. Hall, Mr. Morrow and two Central Dauphin parents wrote a planning grant for Infinity and submitted it to the Pennsylvania Department of Education. This grant was successful and helped fund the initial application process.

In January 2003, the Secretary of Education signed our charter, and Infinity Charter School began. Parents, students, and staff have continuously worked together to make the vision for this school a reality and, in so doing, created a caring, learning community that continues to grow.

OUR CHARTER IS SECURE:

Infinity has had an excellent relationship with the Central Dauphin School, our chartering district. Since opening our doors, our charter has been renewed three times and is now secured until 2022.



ICS RECEIVED THE 2012 U.S. DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AWARD AS A NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED BLUE RIBBON SCHOOL. WE WILL BE ELIGIBLE TO COMPETE FOR THIS AWARD AGAIN IN 2017.

OUR NEW FACILITY


Rendering

new building




SPACE TO LEARN AND GROW

Our plans for the new facility include:

- Modern teaching technology in each classroom
- Computer lab
- Library
- Gymnasium
- Art and music space
- Classrooms for specialized topics
- Green space for experiential learning in environmental sciences and playing fields
- Administrative offices with storage space on school grounds
- Room to expand so that we can accommodate the waiting list of 120 students

SAFER LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

A new building will allow us to:

- Bring security systems up to standard requirements for school safety, which is not possible in our rented building
- Include an intercom system throughout the new building, which will replace our current walkie-talkies and facilitate better communication, especially in emergency situations
- Have an improved and cost/energy-efficient heating and cooling system
- Provide natural light with large, modern windows to create a much more comfortable learning space
- Provide a building and playground built to ADA standards so that students with disabilities will be able to easily navigate the facilities

SUSTAINABILITY

- The new school will be built on a 6-acre plot in Lower Paxton Township just off Locust Lane, which the school has already purchased. There is no mortgage, the land and existing building are fully owned by ICS.
- Our Charter is already secured until 2022 and we have an excellent relationship with our charting district, leaving a clear path to future charter grants.
- With our current student body and existing waiting list, we will have state funds to safely support the school.

FUTURE GROWTH

\$8 MILLION will allow us to construct a state-of-the-art, safe, three-story school surrounded by green space in a suburban setting.

YEAR 1	PHASE I: \$200,000 for groundbreaking PHASE II: \$400,000 to move in with \$250,000 in escrow for building maintenance
YEAR 2	PHASE III: \$3.8 million for 15 classrooms, renovations to existing structure
YEAR 3	PHASE IV: \$3.8 million for gymnasium, more classrooms, and rooms for special topics and instruction.
